NOTES ON RESERVES:

In 2006/07 the Parish Council looked to assist the Village Hall with its aspirations to build an additional storage room and new/enlarged toilet areas (planning permission was granted); quotes received at that time were for over £100,000, money the hall did not have. A new hall was proposed on a nearby development within the Parish so the project was put on hold hoping that perhaps the two could merged into one. After a number of years it became clear that this was not going to happen; the new estate wanted its own community hall. Meanwhile any annual underspend by the Parish Council had been accumulating to give financial support for the original project, which the village hall now needs to revert back to. The Village Hall is an important asset for the Parish.

Additionally, the Church is not on mains water supply and is looking to upgrade some of its lighting; investigations have been ongoing but as the Church is a Grade 1 Listed building these are taking time.
