Parish Council Chairmans report

Bobbing Parish council serves the communities of Bobbing Village, Bobbing Hill, The Grove, The Meads, Howt Green and Keycol Hill plus the surrounding rural areas. During the past year the parish council held 13 regular meetings plus the Parish Council AGM. The meetings were held in the Village Hall on the first Wednesday of the month. Except for the 'Marshgate' (Meads local centre) meeting which was held on Tuesday 15th January.

Residents are always interested and enthusiastic about their neighbourhood and frequently contact the Parish Clerk to know what is happening and impacting on their lives. Being one of the few parishes within the Thames Gateway area and on the edge of Sittingbourne there is always something going on that is affecting our lives. The Parish Council endeavours to listen and take much care resolving parish matters as resources, bureaucracy and time allow. However, ideally, this should be a two way process where the community builds a bond, a partnership with the Parish Council, neither should work in isolation.

Looking back over the past year the parish council became involved with:

Blitzing potholes – A Kent Highways initiative involving parishes to identify all pot holes. Revamping the website – The PC is progressing with its independent website that will allow more interaction with the community and community news.

Revamping the village sign – The weather has taken its toll and we are refreshing the paintwork. Organising a garden competition – Very successful last summer another one will be organised this year. We are also hoping to organise a photographic competition, watch the website for details. Resolving the ongoing traveller problem – Once the red tape had been overcome and after it appeared in the national press, we hope the issues are now resolved.

Creating a footpath between Keycol and Bobbing Hill along the desired line (to match Bobbing Hill Sheppey Way footpath. Also involving minor landscaping to allow bulb planting.

Discussing with KCC the sale of surplus KCC land – 2 plots at Bobbing Hill.

Trying to establish a heritage trail based around local landmarks, the environment and community interests – however without pledges and the support local businesses this is unlikely to happen. SBC reducing financial support to parish councils, resulting in a few more pennies on the parish precept.

Consultation with the Meads developers regarding the Local Centre site. The layout and design of which appears to change frequently.

Planning issues at Howt Green (Large cold store) and Keycol reservoir (Affordable housing) sites.

Residents can always look at the parish web site or pick up the phone and talk and inform us of issues or concerns. If we don't know we cannot help.

Finally Councillor Bob Wileman resigned in December and moved out of the area. We thank him for his time, commitment and contribution at meetings during the years he has spent on the council. In February we held interviews for a replacement Councillor and Shirlee Bennett who lives in Rooks View was co-opted to the council. Parish Council meetings have been very well supported by Mike Baldock (prospective Labour Ward councillor) and Gareth Randall (Conservative Ward councillor).

Planning

During the year the Parish council considered 28 planning applications, 4 more than last year.

Most were for small householder alterations and extensions. However the final parcels of land on the Meads (N of Staplehurst Rd) continue to be redesigned (shops, community services & residential) as does the business park south of Staplehurst Rd. There was a large cold store at Howt Green opposite the 'Dancing Dog Saloon'

- 4. Bobbing Village, reduce speed limit past village school.
- 5. Bobbing Village, grass cutting opposite Bobbing Apple.
- 6. Keycol Hill, Traffic calming (Including white lining)
- 7. Car parking (Non residents) Bobbing Hill, Key Street, Keycol Hill.
- 8. Car parking Hilton Drive (Grove Park School pickup).
- 9. Everywhere, Litter, fly tipping, and wrappers by food shops.
- 10. Everywhere, Overgrown hedgerows especially where footpaths and roads are concerned
- 11. The Meads, Dog Fouling and litter
- 12. The Meads, Damage to bollards and roundabouts.
